1. OPINION EDITORIAL

Homosexuality or Forced Religion Conversions are not any urban concepts

Such quotes by DY Chandrachud highlight the basic need for legalizing same-sex marriage, but the Lok Sabha continues to argue as the plea has not yet been approved. The religion holders of our secular country, India, have also not agreed or shown approval towards same-sex marriage, claiming marriage to be a holy union between a male and a female.

If there is one thing that connects us in society, it has to be the rigid thought process inherited from our ancestors. As the Lok Sabha grapples with the issues of same-sex marriage in India and forced religious conversions post marriage, the law states that no person should directly or indirectly convert from one religion to another by undue influence, force, allurements, or any other deceptive means, whereas the legalization of same-sex marriage remains a question nevertheless. Factors such as increasing disputes, societal respect, and more keep adding to the list of advantages and disadvantages, along with concerns around forced religious conversions.

The plea for legalization of same-sex marriage in India was rejected by the Supreme Court in October 2023, after already securing social security rights for same-sex couples in August 2022 during their live-in relationships and recognizing them as part of a family unit. Elders of traditional Indian households believe that accepting LGBTQ+ community demands creates a negative impact on their grandchildren's lives and that acceptance of same-sex marriages may inspire future generations to follow the same path, creating an imbalance in the world's population. Similarly, in post-marriage religious conversions, certain priests and communities claim it to be an essential ceremony where the bride converts to the groom's religion.

India, as a secular country, experiences many disputes among communities, but the struggle against social and legal discrimination of the LGBTQ+ community remains unchanged, with numerous debate factors adding up from time to time. Although social security rights have been granted to same-sex couples in live-in relationships, the question remains whether society truly grants them the same status as other couples.

Activists also state that the right to family life is a human right and must be protected for everyone without discrimination. This is supported by the fact that multiple foreign countries have recognized and legalized homosexual marriages, while India continues to think backward and restrict basic human rights.

To conclude, forced religious conversions exist in the name of religion and often go unreported, while the legalization of homosexual marriages is not merely about hurting the sentiments of ancestors or religious groups, but about acknowledging the feelings of couples who are disregarded and not considered equal citizens.

As the UNODC convenes to debate the contentious issue of organized crimes over the globe, the atmosphere is charged with both anticipation and differing opinions. The topic "DELIBERATION ON ASSISTANCE TO VICTIMS AND PROTECTION OF WITNESSES OF ORGANIZED CRIMES" aims to provide a pathway to justice and safety, emphasizing the importance of combating organized crime, where organized crime is defined as a category of transnational, national, or local groups of centralized enterprises engaging in illegal activities for personal gain – whether emotional, financial, or physical.

The session commenced with a round of GSL (General Speakers List) allotting 120 seconds to each portfolio with recognitions executive board ; during which the delegates engaged in sharp exchanges and criticism, offering a refreshing departure offering a welcome departure from personal attacks. Several portfolios denounced actions and proceedings of nations supporting organized crimes as inhumane and vulnerable firmly expressing their stance against the nation(s). Following this a prominent voice rose on how are the organized groups getting financed and from where the aids being provided with The TOGO raising POI(s) on USA, sparking a debate in the session as to why only 23 U.S states allow trafficking victims to vacate convictions under laws coerced by cartels with TOGO highlighting UNTOC article 24(1) and 25(2) in his speech.

Throughout the session, delegates reiterated the urgency of finding a sustainable resolution for the protection of witnesses of organized crimes, recognizing its destabilizing effects on the region and the world at large.
